Johnny Johnson emphasized the request to comply with the ENAC agenda items requested to officials with timeframes.

#### A. Navajo Nation, Federal, & State Leadership

1. Navajo Nation President Dr. Buu Nygren/Vice-President Richelle Montoya reported her attendance to all 5-agency inauguration, introduced a new employee, noted projects in communities, honored to hear the Navajo language being spoken, advised to have our children return to our Nation, requested copies of the resolutions so she can assist. Sharlene Sose represented the NN President in providing the report, update on ARPA projects, POINT OF ORDER – asked if she is doing the NN Presidents report on her own, advised of the warehouse in Church Rock area, noted 78 families will receive internet services in Ramah, Executive Order for Navajo language in all communities, noted of the NN President report made available, advised met with NM Governor regarding CIP projects and requesting more funds. Questions from the floor: Where is the NN President, we requested his presence at this meeting, inquiry on the reversion of funds, it was noted these questions are to be brought to the NN President's attention. The other comments were the need to make a changes to secure our funds for the chapters, report Crownpoint nearly had funds reverted, comment made NN that President asks for funds from NM but utilized in Arizona, Shar Sose responded she will set up meeting to meet with Chapters and Project Managers at the President's office, also noted President will be visiting all 110 chapters. Johnny

Johnson noted accountability is necessary and noted expenditure from the Executive office and asked for the purpose of travel and meeting to Washington DC. Other comment made were why the President and Vice President have separate plans. Vice President gave a history of the working relationship with the NN President and concluded her goal is to work with the people to carry out her responsibilities as the NN Vice President. Other questions and comments were made on casino revenue and the buildings going up near the casino. A Special Meeting was requested for March 13, 2025, at Becenti Chapter.

#### VI. ACTION ITEM - Resolutions

#### A. NEW BUSINESS

1. ENAC 03-2025-006: REQUESTING THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL FOR SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION OF \$3,000.000 FROM THE UNRESERVED, NDESIGNATED FUNDS BALANCE (UUFB) FOR 110 CHAPTERS' EMERGENCY FUND TO BE DISTRIBUTED PURSUANT TO THE 50/50 FORMULA

Hoskie Kee explained the resolution requesting supplemental funds for emergency funds from the UUFB account for all 110 chapters, noted some chapters still have a large balance of emergency funds available and some chapters are in deficit, also noted a large balance in the UUFB account and advised the resolution will be given to Delegate Tolth. Young Jeff Tom asked to amend the amount to \$6,000,000. Ervin Chaves reported some chapters are in deficit of utility payment as well due to some chapters living in remote areas and asked to include utility payments allocation in the resolution. Hoskie Kee noted the NNC include the utility payment allocation in the amount of \$1.5M and asked officials to lobby the President not to line item veto the allocation.

2. ENAC 03-2025-007: AFFIRMING THE LEGAL AUTHORITY AND IMPORTANCE OF NAVAJO CHAPTER LOCAL GOVERNMENT RESOLUTIONS IN UPHOLDING GOVERNANCE ACCOUNTABILITY, AND COMMUNITY INTERESTS, AND URGING THE NAVAJO NATION GOVERNMENT AND LEADERSHIP TO RECOGNIZE AND RESPECT THE LEGITIMACY OF THESE RESOLUTIONS

Leonard Francisco explained the resolution that resolutions do not seem to hold their importance and value, noted some examples. Fran George noted resolutions are important but noticed not as important at Window Rock, recommended to establish an archived location especially since officials leave, add this language to the resolution. Rita Capitan noted she agrees with the resolution and recommendation, noted resolutions are neglected at Window Rock, she mentioned the resolution regarding OPVP matter that has not been acted upon. George Tolth advised to ask Rodgerick Begay for more information and noted he can take the resolution for legislation. Jerry Bodie agreed with the resolution and noted the chapter certification is not helpful as certified chapters are being treated as the regular chapter, he asked where the local empowerment and noted the government seems more like a dictatorship and treated as such. Johnny Johnson agreed that the people are the foundation and should be treated as such, recommended another resolution, and advised the membership to review the ENAC Plan of Operation and the government models being discussed. Dave Emerson noted a serious situation, found and shared, noted issues will not be resolve, noted all NN Titles amendments were made but the Navajo Nation Code has not been codified since 2009, noted this is a problem and we are behind on the amendment, advised should be linked to Titles.

ENAC 03-2025-008: REQUESTING AN INVESTIGATION AND AUDIT OF THE NAVAJO NATION CAPITAL PROJECTS MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT (CPMD) BECAUSE OF LONGSTANDING AND UNRESOLVED CONCERNS OVER THE DEPARTMENT'S OVERALL PERFORMANCE AND CONTINUED FAILURE TO MEET ITS OBJECTIVES, WHICH NEGATIVELY IMPACT NOT ONLY NAVAJO CHAPTERS BUT ALSO THE WHOLE NAVAJO NATION'S CAPITAL PROJECTS INVESTMENTS

Leonard Francisco explained the resolution and noted there are numerous chapter projects pending without updates or funds being reverted without any actions, noted this is very concerning. Fran George noted the importance of resolution, her chapter is the forgotten chapter, this department needs to bring reports, funds allocated to the chapter are considered not obligated, projects status unknown, who reports to the chapters for bathroom addition and other

projects, agree this audit can be done sooner than 6 months, asked who is in charge with DCD, asked Tolth for a report, White Horse Lake Chapter went to Santa Fe and learned of 2021 fund in the amount of \$200K yet the chapter did not know, asked President Johnson to concentrate on this resolution, lack of utilities at the chapters is an issue. Johnny Johnson asked for officials to be available for a meeting when scheduled.

4. ENAC 03-2025-009: REQUESTING THE NAVAJO TRIBAL UTILITY AUTHORITY (NTUA) TO IMPROVE COMMUNCIATION CHANNELS FOR REPORTING OUTAGES AND WATER BREAKS, INCLUDING LIVE SUPPORT, CLEAR CONTACT INFORMATION, AND THE INCLUSION OF THE NAVAJO LANGUAGE IN COMMUNICATIONS

Leonard Francisco explained the resolution and informed of the concern of NTUA not informing the public of water outage and noted the availability of the media that can be used to make announcements but not used. Anita Benally noted at the Top of the World, Continental Divide the water divides, get inclement weather conditions, recently below zero, NTUA attended the chapter meeting and provided information to the membership, NTUA and homeowner responsibilities described, Thoreau residents experienced water issues. Harvey Williams noted the snow accumulation at Chichiltah area, water frozen, NTUA notified but referred to other technician but did not respond, noted they only work only Monday to Friday, closed weekends and after hours. Johnny Johnson advised to start plans for mitigation annually before inclement weather, should have Alert Team, VP to coordinate a presentation at the next meeting.

5. ENAC 03-2025-010: REQUESTING THE LAW & ORDER COMMITTEE OF THE 25<sup>TH</sup> NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL TO INTRODUCE LEGISLATION FOR NAVAJO NATION CRIME STOPPERS PROGRAM AND REWARD FUNDS TO HELP THE LAW ENFORCEMENT IN CRIMINAL CASES THAT REMAIN UNRESOLVED

Anita Benally explained the resolution – English language to be primary language by Executive Order by President Trump / NN President signed legislation for Navajo language as the official language for the Nation. Larry Etsitty, Criminal Investigation noted the need for an establishment of a Navajo Nation Crime Stopper Program and reward for tipsters if it leads to arrest and conviction, noted the need for closure for families of victims, presented the history of Navajo Public Safety by BIA Law & Order which included Community Policing and Neighborhood Watch programs, Non-Indian individuals believed the Navajo laws did not cover them, asking for establishment of Crime Stoppers and funds for the program from the NNC, noted law enforcement cannot do this alone, advised of television shows relating to crime that takes one hour to resolve crimes but that is not reality, requested for support and hopes for this program to be initiated to help solve crimes across the Nation.. Nora Morris noted drug usage is not mentioned, noted in Tohajilee there are drugs being abused and sold which creates hardship in the community, noted these need to be mentioned, partnership mentioned but there is no cross-commission, no uniformed officer, frustrating there are no officers in the community, Crime Stopper will really help, recommend to mention the drugs and cross-commission. Robinson Tom noted he volunteered as substance abuse counselor with the Police Department, noted they are going through a lot, need to take care of our police officers, asked to support the resolution, noted only see this in the city and municipalities, advised grateful for the resolution. Fran George inquired on when does a case become a cold case, asked if this includes are crimes and noted this is a wonderful idea to help our families. Larry Etsitty replied he agrees wholeheartedly and recommended bringing this out and this could help all cases not just the cold cases. Noted an example 3 hit and run incidents that became stale and remained unresolved, noted will probably be a case-by-case situation.

ENAC 03-2025-011: RECOMMENDING TO THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL ABOUT THE NNC LEGISLATION CJA-08-24 STRICT MANDATE BY RELINQUISH, AMEND OR REVERSE THE "INELIGILITY TO RUN FOR ELECTED OFFICE(S) FOR FIVE (5) YEARS FOR NOT SUBMITTING THE CAMPAIGN EXPENSE REPORT AS REQUIRED", AND AMEND THE STRICT PENALTY BY IMPOSING A FINE OF TWO HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$250) AS A FIRST VIOLATION

Anslem Morgan noted the legislation to disqualify for 5 years which is a petty misdemeanor, all the leaders not told they are disqualified, military persons will also disqualified, went to OHA to appeal, 192 over 100 filed appeal, we do not want to be the cage for 5 years, ask to recall the legislation and fine instead, noted elected federal officials do not face such time, Board of Election Supervisors and Chapter officials are impacted by this. Heather Yazzie-Kinlacheeny noted to consider this resolution, as Navajo Lobbyist proper communication plan across the Navajo Nation is essential, a 2-page legal jargon document is not sufficient, noted the importance when council passes legislation is at the cost, advised of dealing with chapter official vacancies, mainly secretary treasurer positions, noted the many elections which has an additional cost that has taken place with another one coming up soon, at least \$10,000 of NN money being used, urge as Chapter Officials this does this affect our community. Young Jeff Tom noted there is already a law, used to have

elections, already has information for financial report to submit, after election there was no enforcement therefore unable to act, law is amended to disqualify candidates and not able to file for candidacy for 5 years, noted he did his part, noted McKinley County and State have the same law. Jerry Bodie noted the 5 years seems too long, vacancies noted, appreciate the current officers, we are the forgotten, young people to be leaders are hesitant, asked others to file for candidate, he filed an appeal because he forgot to file, shared his experience of oath of office scheduled then cancelled but rescheduled immediately, finally noted to eliminate the 5 years prohibition for candidacy. Anslem noted the law is not being challenged but the part of imposing a fine of \$250 as first offender rather than prohibition of 5 years for candidacy and the rest of the legislation is to remain the same. Nora Morris noted the law went through the procedure properly – 5 day period for all legislation, lesson learned and should know, recommended to leave it. Lucy Antone noted she was disqualified as well and filed an appeal, but was reinstated, we do not listen and we do not teach our children, provided written report.

Johnny Johnson noted one letter of interest submitted and renewed interest, Nora Morris and Titus Nez Nora Morris noted there were 2 dates was the reason for submission of letter of interest. Johnny Johnson clarified the time of letters submitted. Anslem Morgan noted he served as a Commissioner which included - 5 members from chapters, ENAC's appointment will represent 31 chapters, nominee must have vision for the government and the people, this is our only voice, if they do away with chapter, we will lose our voice, one of the discussion is amendment to Title 26, Rodgerick Begay has 4 models he has been sharing, commissioner also looking at ways to modify the government, Title 26 authorizes Chapter Officials for meetings only, there are two (2) participants from College programs, a representative from Navajo Women, and one (1) OPVP appointment and one (1) from Legislative Branch and Judicial Branch that comprises of the commission, noted of the quorum issue, representative must be an elected official, he recommend Dave Emerson as nominee from ENAC, noted NNC did away with Commission but with the Shirley v Morgan it was restored, advised your voice is needed at the top level, Titus Nez noted he submitted a letter of interest, is school board as second term, we are asked where are our children and they should be considered for positions such as this one, advised to consider representation including the youth, noted they have plans and ways to make changes, noted he sees meetings being rushed. Anslem Morgan clarification noted was the representation must be sitting elected official. Harrison Tsosie tasks to look at NN government structure , laws, regulations, analyze it and develop a proposal for government reform, current government is a temporary government until people adopt a permanent government, working on proposal for permanent government, the 1921 established government is still be used, language BIA used to establish can be incorporated including fundamental law into governmental level, noted this is all about law, create a Nation and how to rule is by laws, a criteria for the representative must understand laws to build a nation, unitary government, federal government, qualifications exist, 12 position 5 to be nominated by agency councils, must be an elected serving chapter official, grazing board, land board or school board member, noted they are looking for people with expertise, County School Board – state derived. Young Jeff Tom asked for nominee to keep the public informed, noted the need for changing the government. Dave Emerson noted he wants to share that Percy Anderson recommended him as a nominee, not elected for his personal interest, has an interest to help, he shared rules of order, brought up the BIM that most people do not understand and he is willing to share that with chapters, advised of the 4 models and will always have documents, IRA – strategy to visit each chapter, asked if membership is aware of the Wheeler Hauler Act, noted showing these documents to gain confidence from membership and he is ready. POINT OF ORDER - Ervin Chavez off the resolution topic, return to the subject. Question of Privilege - who is being recommended. Johnny Johnson replied that 3 officials submitted letter of interest, Dave Emerson was the person that met the deadline, therefore voting for Mr. Emerson as the ENA Representative.

Jennifer Morgan noted we talk our language here in the meeting but not at home, the teachers to teach our children they can read and write, our children ask us to help them with homework, one word this is how, noted words are said differently, whether we realize it or not, we are moving into a world of AI, the glitter world. Jacob Largo noted the project to Navajo language syntax still learning to speak write as it is pronounced. Cajuan attempts to teach the Navajo language and asked for support of the resolution.
